

Trail Information

The Quail Hollow Mountain Bike Trail is a 4 mile loop designed and maintained by CAMBA. Cleveland Area Mountain Bike Association. It is located about one half mile from the Park Entrance. At the trailhead there is a small parking lot, an information kiosk and restrooms. The trail is marked with arrows to indicate the direction of flow. Always stay to the right when starting from the trailhead. CAMBA describes the trail as mostly beginner to intermediate. PLEASE NOTE - CAMBA strongly advises against riding the trail in wet or muddy conditions. Damage inflicted by muddy riding is very difficult to recover from and greatly increases the job of trail maintenance.

Quail Hollow State Park

Quail Hollow State Park is located 1 mile northeast of Hartville on Congress Lake Rd (North Prospect in Hartville). The 698 acre park was owned by Harry Bartlett Stewart and his wife MInnie and later by their son Harry Bartlett Stewart Jr and his wife Catherine. Both father and son were chairman of the board and chief executive officer of the Akron. Canton and Youngstown Railroad. The Stewarts lived here until 1975 when they sold the property to the state for half its appraised valuation.

The 40 room manor house, completed in 1929, is currently used for group affairs and as a visitor Center. There are 12 miles of hiking trails, 5 miles of bridle trails, and the 4 mile mountain bike trail in the park. The trails provide excellent cross country skiing in the winter. In addition to acres of wild flowers there are many formal gardens and a large herb garden in the park. Shady Lane Pond is open for fishing to anyone with an Ohio fishing license. The park is open from 6am to 11pm. No Fee.
