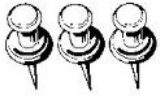

We send our condolences to the families of Bill Trissel for the loss of his brother and Linda Christmas for the loss of her father.

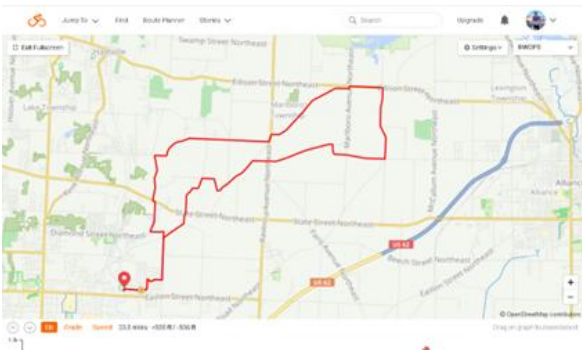

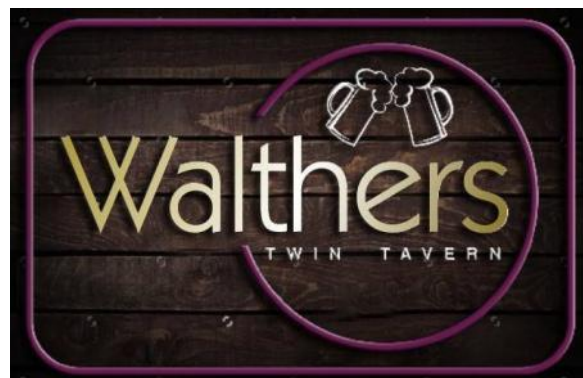

SCBC March meeting program report

Shane Moore gave an entertaining presentation of the cycling trip in the Alsace region of France with Bruce Treiber, Mel Siebert, Bob Doerschuk, Chuck Knott, and Stuart Hamilton. The trip took place in June of 2025 and they boosted the local economy with their pastry and beer consumption while cycling through beautiful (and hilly/mountainous) countryside. Their accommodations were an AirBnB with the craziest elevator in the world - ask them about it!



2026 Ephemeral Ride - Saturday, April 25, 2026

Spring has sprung! Time for our annual trip to Lisbon, Ohio to see the trillium and other ephemeral wildflowers on the Greenway Trail! In my humble opinion, this trail is the prettiest rail-trail in the area, especially when the wildflowers are in bloom.

Last year we planned 2 rides, the first on the Greenway Trail and the second in Mill Creek Park. However, we didn't ride in the afternoon due to lack of interest. We will make that call this year before the Greenway ride starts. A 1-mile hike in Poland Woods (Bluebell Trail) is an option that I recommend, but not on the schedule due to the added time that it takes. The walk is gorgeous when the Virginia bluebells are in bloom - they cover the forest floor. If you make the trip from your Stark County home base, it's worth your time to add an afternoon ride or walk in the Y'town area!

The rides are on paved surfaces, including trails and roads. They are no-drop and listed as Open classification. They are easy (the rail-trail) to "moderately" hilly (the park roads).

The plan is:

- 9:30 a.m. - Start time at the Little Beaver Creek Greenway Trailhead (aka P.L.& W. Railroad Station) located in Lisbon at 232 S. Market St., Lisbon OH. Very nice restrooms with flush toilets (if they are open). It is an out and back 25-mile ride through the forested Little Beaver Creek valley, with the 12.5-mile turn-around at the Washingtonville trailhead. Sights include the Teegarden covered bridge, the Leetonia beehive coke ovens park, and a spectacular white trillium display. www.trailink.com/trail/little-beaver-creek-greenway-trail/

- 12:00 (estimated) - Riders will be on their own for lunch and other side trips. It's about a 35-minute drive from Lisbon to Fellows Riverside Gardens. Two favorite restaurants are Pondi's (east of Lisbon) and Inner Circle Pizza in Canfield (about a 25 min. drive). There are picnic areas close to Fellows Riverside Gardens at the intersection of Price Rd and Milton Ave near the Boathouse at Glacier Lake. Nice place to eat outside by the water.

In this time slot, riders can take a tour of Fellows Riverside Gardens. Admission is free. There are beautiful plantings of tulips, daffodils, hyacinths and spring-flowering shrubs.

- 2:00 -2:30 p.m. (pending) - Start time at the parking lot at Fellows Riverside Gardens. I'll confirm the time with a SCBC FB post, because it's dependent on how the morning goes. This is a 16-mile loop ride through Mill Creek Park. There are some hill climbs and scenic overlooks mixed in. We'll be on park roads and trail segments. Historic sights are Lanterman's Mill and Falls (c.1845), the Silver Suspension Bridge (c.1895), the Mill Creek furnace (c.1830's), the Old Log Cabin (c.1814) and the Parapet Bridge (c.1913). We should finish by 4:00, which will leave time to visit the gardens after the ride. The history of this area and the park is really interesting. www.millcreekmetroparks.org

The two bike routes are map 951-1 and 951-3 in SCBC Ride Maps. If the 25th is a rain-out, I'll make the decision Friday night and post on our FB page.

Stark County Bicycle Club Ride Schedule Information

SCBC RIDE GUIDELINES HELMETS ARE REQUIRED ON ALL CLUB RIDES AND INVITATIONALS

Participants under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a parent or other adult supervisor on all rides and at all Club activities.

Club rides are listed with letters denoting the Ride classification so riders will know if a ride is suited to their skill level.

Registration for all rides will be 15 minutes prior to the starting time listed.

Please call the Ride Leader or Road Captain if you have any questions about weather, route or difficulty of ride

Most of our rides can easily be shortened, if you are looking for less distance. Just let the ride leader know your intentions.

Non-Members are always welcome on club rides

Dress appropriately for the weather conditions.

CLASS A - Fast pace (over 19mph). An **A** rider is in excellent condition, can maintain a 19 mph pace for extended periods, and can complete a century (100 miles), even in adverse conditions of weather, traffic and terrain, in under 7 hours.

CLASS B - Moderately fast pace (15 -19 mph). A **B** rider is a strong rider, feels comfortable sharing the road with traffic, and can complete a century (100 miles) in under 8 hours.

CLASS C - Moderate pace (10 -14 mph). A **C** rider is a competent rider, in good conditions, can handle most traffic conditions, and can complete a 50 mile ride in under 6 hours.

CLASS D - Slow pace (5—9 mph). A **D** rider is a steady rider who may not feel comfortable in traffic and does not wish to attempt rides in excess of 20 miles. Should be able to complete a 20 mile ride in 3 hours

CLASS O - Open pace. Class **O** is given to a ride on which riders, including the ride leader, will be riding at whatever pace they choose.

CLASS MTB - Trail rides which may require technical ability or special bikes. These trails may have obstacles such as rocks, mud, logs or stream crossings.

CLASS NR - New Rider. Class **NR** is given to a ride specifically intended for new riders, who may be new to group riding. The ride leader will attempt to communicate "rules of the road" and will always stay with the slowest rider. Everyone is encouraged to ride together at the pace determined by those participating.

CLASS TRL - Rides which are entirely on trails or bike paths. They may be paved or hard packed

TOURIST CLASS - A special designation given to **C** and **D** rides which are designed to appeals to those who don't mind riding long distances, but who also like to take their time and stop to see places of interest along the way. These rides will generally have a destination of special interest where time will be taken to explore, investigate and enjoy the sights. All riders will be encouraged to ride together in a group with the ride leader.

Venice, Florida 2027

Looking for an escape from the January cold? Consider joining the SCBC bike tour in Venice, Florida the last 2 weeks of January. Each year SCBC hosts a bike tour in Venice, Florida which offers a fun, collaborative experience with a mix of outdoor coastal adventures, historic charm, a vibrant art scene and the opportunity to change up the landscape and get away from the cold dreary weather of Ohio!

It's so refreshing to wake up to sunshine every morning. And the only decisions you have to make are choosing where you want to ride and where to have dinner!

Riding

SCBC generally offers multiple ride options each day from easy trail rides to longer adventures.

Did you know that there is 18.5 miles of paved trail from Venice to Sarasota on the Legacy trail? And an additional 5 miles on the Venetian Waterway paved trail that connects to the Legacy trail, for walking, riding or running. There is a great trail in the Deer Creek Nature preserve that connects to Northport (with a fantastic cafe). So, if you're not fond of the road, Venice offers more than just road riding. However, there are bike lanes on just about every road we ride on, making it a different experience than what you may be accustomed to here in Ohio. For those of you who enjoy longer rides there are numerous routes honed over the years from the northern tip of Anna Marie Island to the southern tip of Gasparilla Island.

Relaxation

For your non-riding time you can relax by the pool in the enclosed courtyard or take a hike at one of the many nature preserves. Yoga is offered on Venice Beach every morning at 8am, 9am and 5pm with the option to stay and watch the sunset or even attend a free drum circle on the beach.

There are free pickle balls courts, parks and beaches for hiking, swimming, shell collecting and kayak rentals.

Beaches and Outdoor Fun:

Caspersen Beach is famous for finding shark teeth. Venice beach offers sand volleyball and is close to downtown. The Venice Jetty is great for watching boat traffic, surfing and dolphin spotting. Oscar Scherer State Park offers kayaking and hiking just north of South Venice.

Culture and Historic Downtown Venice:

OLD BUSINESS

E-Bike Policy

Dave Cardarella notified Dave Swinehart of the need for throttle use by tandems (and eBike conversions by Don Royer) for starting, and on hills. This requires a change to the club's E-Bike policy. Item 2 of the E-Bike policy will now read:

2. E-Bikes are eligible to participate in group rides and must be operated as pedal-assist only. If the E-Bike includes a throttle, THE THROTTLE MUST NOT BE USED except under approved, special circumstances.

The E-Bike policy on the website will be updated with the new language. Any E-Bike rider needing to use their throttle, should notify the ride leader before the start of the ride.

NEW BUSINESS

Change to Membership Dues Year

The board voted to change the membership dues year to run from November 1 through October 31st. This change will take effect November 1, 2026. Dues for this current year are still due by the end of this month. This change will align the dues and mileage years. It will make it more straightforward in determining eligibility for emeritus status (80 year olds).

MailChimp

How Much Air Pollution Is Prevented When Commuting by Bicycle?

10 mile round trip commute 5 days a week for a year (2600 miles annually)

Small car	35 mpg	68 gallons of gas	.7 Tons of CO ₂
Midsized car	20 mpg	124 gallons of gas	1.3 Tons of CO ₂
SUV or 4x4	14 mpg	170 gallons of gas	1.9 Tons of CO ₂

And those are just the pollutants from fuel use. From the foam and plastic in its seats to the petroleum in its tires, each car is a small pollution factory. Several tons of waste and 1.2 billion cubic yards of polluted air are generated in its manufacture alone! In 2008 the US produced 1.6 million metric tons of waste mining ore for automotive production. In the US each year, painting and coating cars produces 40 million pounds of air releases and 24 million pounds of hazardous wastes.

During its lifetime, on the road, each car produces another 1.3 billion cubic yards of polluted air and scatters an additional 40 pounds of worn tire particles, brake debris and worn road surface into the atmosphere.

Bicycling significantly reduces transportation emissions while also reducing traffic congestion and the need for petroleum. The total number of pounds of pollutants, (comprised of hydrocarbons, carbon monoxide, nitrogen oxides and carbon dioxide), emitted per year is 12,140.30 lbs/year (or 0.97 lbs/mile) for passenger cars and 17,025.80 lbs/year (or 1.21 lbs/mile) for light trucks.
